#### Open Scholarship Programme

- ☐ Responsibilities include the management:
  - Mandated submission of research articles in the UPSpace repository
  - Mandated submission of theses and dissertations
  - Collaboration with the Department Research & Innovation on the annual Research report
  - Advice and facilitation of Open Access journal initiatives on campus
  - Coordination and planning of Open Access Week events on campus





#### What is Open Access?

- Open Access resources
  - Free of charge
  - Full-text access to variety of materials
- What makes it possible?
  - Internet
  - Consent of the author/copyright-holder
- Two roads to Open Access
  - Open Access repositories (green road)
  - Open Access journals (gold road)





## What kinds of material are available via Open Access?

- Journal articles■ Preprints
  - Postprints
  - Final publisher's version
  - Scanned versions of formerly print only journals, such as HTS Teologiese Studies / Theological Studies
- ☐ Theses and dissertations
- ☐ Other material grey material
- Datasets for the future






## ROAR: Registry of Open Access Repositories



#### UP Open Scholarship Office & ILL partnership

- ☐ ILL and Open Access share common history
  - Publisher resistance
  - Copyright regulations
- □ ILL and Open Scholarship Office's common goal
  - Both are responsible for access to information
  - Both have to comply with copyright regulations
- □ Common problem : thesis/dissertation is requested but only a printed copy is available
- ☐ Creative decision let's work together in providing access to information!


- UPeTD's access options

  - Campus availability
  - Restricted for a limited time
  - Total embargo
- Turnaround time
- Copyright

## Benefits for role-players

- Open Scholarship Office
  - Increased visibility
  - Worldwide, immediate, electronic access anyone, anywhere as long as you have internet access
  - Open Access can incorporate visually appealing features such as photographs, graphs, multimedia, hyperlinks, supplemental files and data
  - Increased impact in the subject field





#### Benefits for role-players continued

- - Hard copies not lost in transit!
  - Open access material saves time and response time is quicker
  - Save costs of shipping, as URL is now supplied
  - Increase fill-rate of requests
  - More grey literature is available for distribution





#### Open Access has brought about change...

- ☐ Access to information becomes increasingly easier
- Open Access movement is gaining momentum
- ☐ Each year more and more Open Access journals are published
- ☐ There are more gateways to electronic information
- ☐ The question is thus:

If more content is freely available, will there be less ILL requests?





#### Surprising finding....

□ Profiles of Best Practices in Academic Library Interlibrary Loan (Primary Research Group) describing the ILL efforts of 9 leading American colleges:



Open Access and institutional repositories have NOT impacted substantially on ILL...(YET)!

- Many researchers will continue to need assistance
- ☐ Interlending officers are still information navigators



#### Do we make a difference? Testimonial 1

The Cronjé proefskrif has been enlightening! The ETD system and dspace/Africana have both been very, very useful resources, and I am very glad UP has policies that makes it possible to obtain older materials. Many ETD and digital collections set a firm wall in the past and refuse to consider anything older, but in SA history it is essential to draw in older material because there are many cases where no other studies exist and basic history must still be written. Too many foreign scholars have simply overlooked proefskrif work from SA institutions outright because of limited accessibility in the past, but this system changes the matter radically. When I had to obtain theses from XXX University in 2008 for example I had to obtain money orders in Rand (not easy in the USA) and they sent me a hardcopy a month later! That is inefficient, to put it mildly.
