Rhinosteros-bosch—*Stoebe rhinocerotis*.
Zuyker-bosch—*Protea mellifera*.
Chinese Rose—*Rosa semperflorens*.
Waxberry-bush—*Myrica cordifolia*.
Poison-apple—*Solanum sodomeum*, (a prickly shrub).
Bosch-tau or Bavianstau—*Cynanchum obtusifolium*, (other plants are also called so).
Bamboo—*Bambusa arundinacea*.
Spanish Riet—*Arundo donax*.
Aloes, several sorts—Of the genus *Aloë*, nearly all the species are indigenous at the Cape.
Agave Americana is found about Capetown.
Fahlblar—A small species of *Aloe*, blueish leaf, scarlet flower.
Farkblar—(pig-leaf), *Calla Ethiopica*.
Pisang—The sort growing wild in the Zuureveld, is *Strelitzia reginæ*; that which grows in Plettenberg-bay, is *Strelitzia augusta*.
Indian Fig—*Cactus opuntia*, used for fences.
Hottentot Fig—*Mesembryanthemum edule*.
Chandelier—*Brunsvigia multiflora*.
Seven-years-flower—*Gnaphalium eximium*, with a leaf like woollen cloth. Several kinds.
Riet Reed Rush—*Restio*. Various sorts are used for thatching.
Palmite—*Juncus serratus*, of Thunberg.
Papküll—*Typha latifolia*.
Bavians-blom—Is a name given to various species of *Babiana*'s.
Hottentot food—A bulb with a long stalk.
Moss—The long-hanging kind is a species of *Usnea*.
Bukku—A medicinal plant of singular virtue.

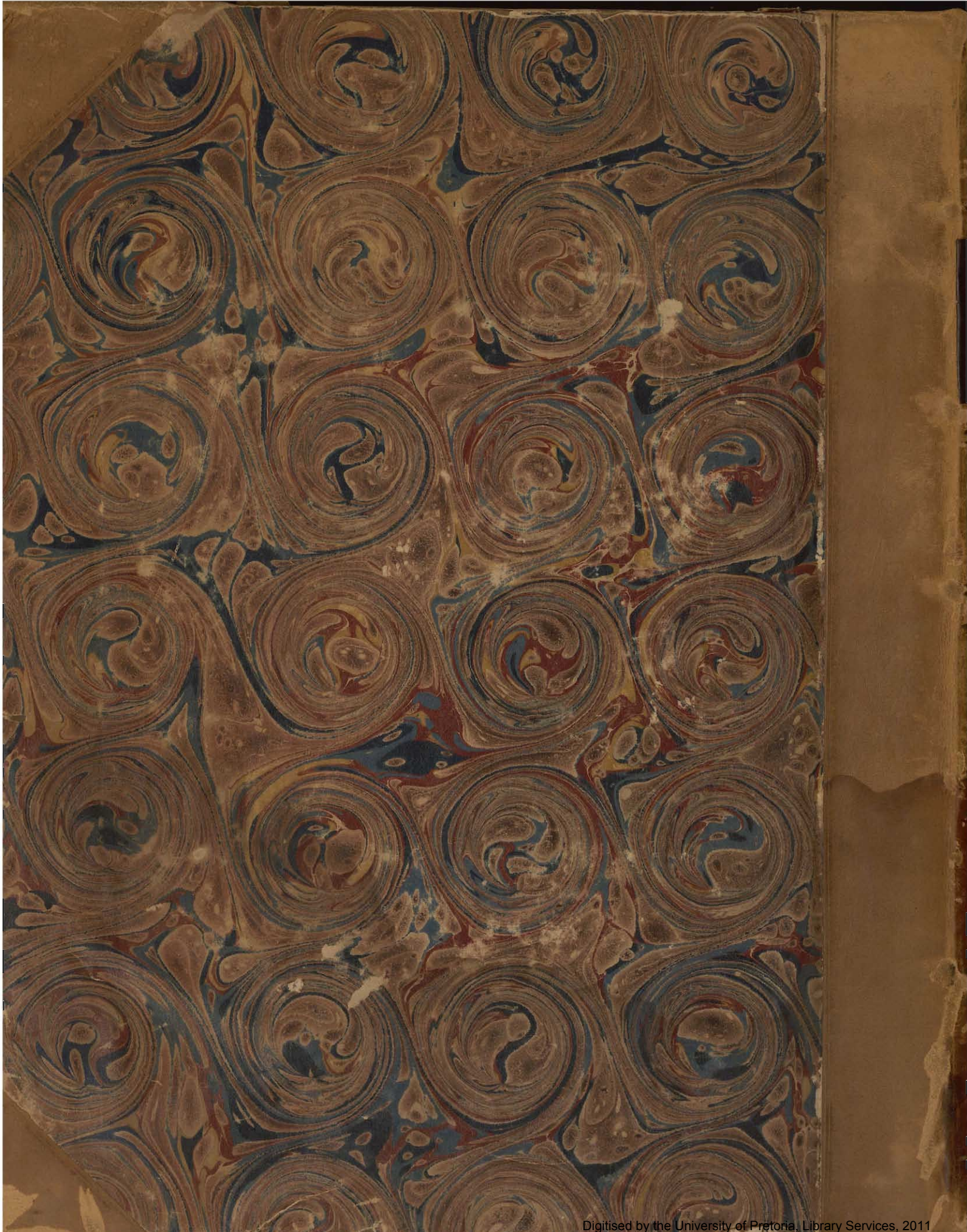
