REPORTED ACTIVITIES OF THE LIBRARIES AND OTHER LIBRARY NEWS

- ABERDARE.** *The Western Mail* of October 11th, reports that the Aberdare Council has rejected an offer of premises in the town which could be purchased at £3,000 for conversion into a public library.
- ALTRINCHAM.** *The Knutsford Guardian* of October 7th, says that during August 25,577 books were issued from the Altrincham Library, compared with 21,237 in August last year, an increase of 4,340. From branch libraries a total of 10,999 books were issued, compared with 9,013 in August 1937. Issues from junior libraries increased by 820 to 3,225. Mr. W. G. Bosworth is Chief Librarian.
- BAKEWELL.** *The Sheffield Independent* of October 5th, states that Bakewell Market Hall is to be offered to the Derbyshire County Education Committee, as from next January, to be used for a regional library.
- BATLEY.** *The Batley News* of October 8th, reports that during July and August 21,655 books were issued from Batley Public Library lending department, 2,471 from the young people's department and 170 from the reference department.
- BIRSTALL.** *The Batley News* of October 8th, reports that 8,099 books were issued from the Birstall Branch Library during July and August.
- BLACKPOOL.** *The Blackpool Gazette* of October 8th, publishes an interesting article on the work of library assistants in Blackpool's Public Library.
- CALLINGTON.** *The Western Weekly News* of September 17th, announces that, following the resignation of Mrs. F. I. Pascoe, Miss E. Trustcott has been appointed Librarian at the Callington branch of the Devon County Library.
- DEWSBURY.** *The Batley News* of October 8th, says that the latest monthly report of the Dewsbury Librarian shows that 16,475 books were issued against 14,220 in the corresponding period last year.
- EAST FINCHLEY.** *The Hendon Times* of October 7th, describes the opening of East Finchley's £13,000 branch library. This opens with a stock of 13,000 volumes, including 2,500 in the junior room. Mr. F. Seymour Smith is Librarian.
- FOLKESTONE.** *The Daily Telegraph* of October 8th, says that Folkestone readers are reading better books. Figures for the central library given in the annual report show that between 1932 and 1938 there was an increase of 45.9 per cent. in books of philosophy, over 68 per cent. in religion, 54.2 per cent. in languages, 109.9 per cent. in useful arts and over 100 per cent. in fine arts.
- HINCKLEY.** *The Leicester Mail* of October 6th, announces that a branch of the Hinckley Library has been opened at Burbage.
- KELTY.** *The Dunfermline Press* of October 8th, states that books issued from the Kelty Institute branch library during September totalled 3,526 volumes.
- LONG EATON.** *The Nottingham Evening Post* of October 10th, reports that for the year ended March last there was a decrease of just over 1,000 in the number of books issued from Long Eaton Public Library. The total issue for the year was 190,598. The junior section accounted for the decrease in issue, this being affected by the provision of school libraries by the Education Committee. The number of books in the library was 19,101.
- MIDDLETON.** *The Middleton Guardian* of October 8th, states that during July 12,902 books were issued from the Middleton Public Library, compared with 10,812 in July, 1937. During August 11,010 books were issued, compared with 9,321 in the corresponding month last year.
- MONMOUTHSHIRE.** *The Yorkshire Observer* of October 11th, announces that Miss R. L. Armsby, librarian in charge of the Windhill branch of the Shipley Public Libraries, has been appointed county librarian to the Monmouthshire Education Committee. Miss Armsby took up her new duties on October 7th.
- MONTROSE.** *The Montrose Standard* of October 7th, says that during September, the number of books issued from the Montrose Library lending department totalled 6,516, compared with 6,567 during September last year.
- OXFORD.** *The Oxford Mail* of October 11th, says that the Oxford Librarian has produced a list of books on advertising, publicity and salesmanship which can be found in the Central Library. The booklet has been prepared for the use of members of the Oxford Advertising Club.
- PERTH.** *The Perthshire Advertiser* of October 5th, states that during September 29,290 books were issued from the Perth Sandeman Public Library, compared with 28,371 in September last year.
- RICHMOND.** *The Richmond Herald* of October 8th, reports proceedings of a meeting of the Richmond Public Library Committee at which it was stated that during the quarter ending September 30th, 64,183 books were issued, compared with 61,621 for the corresponding period last year. Books on such subjects as engineering, business and political science showed large increases.
- RINGWOOD.** *The Southern Daily Echo* of October 7th, reports that during the year ended September 30th, last, 53,303 books were issued from the Ringwood Public Library, compared with 45,809 the previous year, an increase of 7,494. The book stock shows an increase of 205, the total now being 3,800. Books in stock consist of: Adult fiction, 2,192; non-fiction, 761; juvenile fiction, 688; non-fiction, 159. Mr. H. J. Lay is Librarian.

REPORTED ACTIVITIES OF THE LIBRARIES—*continued.*

STOCKHOLM. *The Children's Newspaper* of October 8th, publishes a description of a library in Sweden which has one of the biggest children's libraries in the world. There are 40,000 volumes in this library which is housed in an annex of the Stockholm City Library.

TODMORDEN. *The Todmorden News* of September 30th, states that the number of adults now using the Todmorden Public Library is 9,604, representing 43.2 per cent. of the population. The number of volumes issued at the central and branch libraries during the past year was 208,126, compared with 215,647 in the previous year, while 23,243 volumes were issued at school libraries, an increase of 1,818. During the year 2,225 volumes were added to stock, 268 were re-placed, 1,110 were re-bound and 1,051 were withdrawn. The amount spent on new books and replacements totalled over £420 during the year. Mr. V. Cronshaw is Borough Librarian.

YORK. *The Yorkshire Evening Press* of October 8th, publishes a photograph of the children's department, a feature of the extensions at York Public Library which are to be opened on October 26th. This section contains about 4,000 books. Another outstanding feature is the new reference library, which was described in the *Yorkshire Herald* of October 8th. In this there is accommodation for 3,500 books, while a further 15,000 are contained in an adjoining room.

LIBRARY PUBLICATION.

SWINTON AND PENDLEBURY. We have received from the Swinton and Pendlebury libraries details of their programme of lectures and other winter activities. In addition to many interesting lectures, on a variety of subjects, the Guild of Library Players is presenting one programme each month. An excellent help in connection with the lectures is the list of books, published in the programme which deal with the subjects to be treated. A number of exhibitions have been arranged to take place at the Central Library and these should attract great attention.

THE BOOK TRADE IN THE NEWS

BRITISH LIBRARY IN NEW YORK. The British Library of Information at 270, Madison Avenue, New York City, was described in *The Birmingham Post* of October 11. This institution has been maintained since 1920 by the British Government as part of its official establishment in the United States. The library contains some 20,000 official documents with 2,000 reference works and files of a number of periodicals.

PRISON LIBRARIES. An article on the organisation of prison libraries was published in *The Northern Daily Telegraph* of October 3. Most of the books are obtained from one of the largest circulation libraries in London, after they have been withdrawn from use, and sent to Wormwood Scrubs prison where they are sorted. They have to be shared among forty prisons and Borstal institutions. In some of the larger prisons there are as many as 20,000 volumes in use.

PRIVATE LIBRARIES. The ninth of a series on Private Libraries, published in *The Times Literary Supplement* of October 8, dealt with that of Sir Maurice Holmes. His collection is notable for a large number of books on Captain Cook.

ST. JOHN ASSOCIATION LIBRARY WORK. A description of the work of the Order of St. John Hospital Library Association, Queen's Gardens, London, W.2, appeared in *The Sunday Times* of October 16. The association has supplied over 11,000,000 books to sick people. It supplied reading matter to 2,000 hospitals in Great Britain and Ireland, to naval and military hospitals all over the world and even to leper colonies. Over 8,000 books are sent out each week.

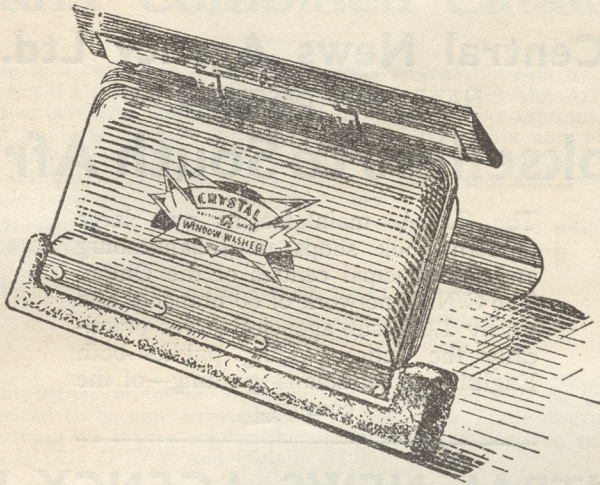

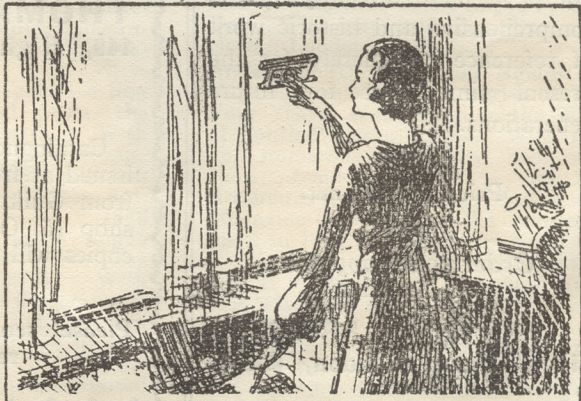
