ROOF DESIGN COMPETITION.

ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS RAISED BY COMPETITORS.

These now form part of the "Conditions of Competition".

Numbers correspond to Question Numbers.

- 1. The roof will be judged on its merits. A roof construction adaptable to various types of house is to be preferred to a less flexible design.

 While economy in design will be expected, it must nevertheless be understood that the cost factor is not theessence of this Competition.

- 4. If patented materials are included in the design the Competitor must
 - a) give the formula which may be on a separate sheet of paper. The formula will not be disclosed by the Assessors;

b) furnish proof that the material is actually produced in South

Africa and available in adequate quantities;

c) furnish evidence of the maximum price of such material, f.o.r. Works.

5a. Clause 4 is now amended to read:

"A patented design will be accepted on condition that the holder of the patent agrees to allow his design to be used freely without infringement of his patent rights and without payment of Royalty until such time as the Government control of building material ceases to operate."

- 5b. The Building Controller on behalf of the Government agrees to cede its rights under Clause 6 of the Conditions to the designer when Government control of building materials ceases to operate.
- 6. See Answers 4 and 5.
- 7. The Competitor should give his estimate of cost of material and erection. With reference to materials, sources of supply should be stated.
- 8. There is no limit to the number of designs, but each design must be enclosed in a separate package complete with separate declaration with name and address. Additional official envelopes can be obtained from the Secretary, Building Control.
