

BRICKMAKING.

SUGGESTED TYPE OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN
LOCAL AUTHORITY AND BRICKMAKER.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN.....

AND

It is hereby agreed that the above
will proceed to the town of and
there commence brickmaking for the said
all in accordance as hereafter agreed to.

- (1) A site for the brickmaking will be decided upon and handed over to the said for his brickmaking activities until such time that the local authority decides it has a sufficient number of bricks or this agreement becomes null and void as hereafter stated.
- (2) The Consultant engaged by the local authority to be the judge as to whether the bricks are suitable for the purpose for which the local authority requires them. In the event of the bricks made by the said proving to be of inferior quality and are condemned by the said Consultant then this agreement becomes null and void and the said will not be entitled to any remuneration for any work which he might have done or monies which he might have expended.
- (3) The said will provide all equipment and labour necessary for making the bricks on the site and will be paid at the rate of £-.-.- per 1000 bricks, for all bricks made by him and approved of as before mentioned in Clause (2). The bricks will be accepted by the local authority at the brickmaking site and they will do all necessary cartage to the building site.
- (4) The local authority undertakes to provide the following facilities whilst the said is engaged in brickmaking on the site agreed upon.
 - (a) Sleeping accommodation for two Natives at the brickmaking site.
 - (b) Not less than No. 1 E.C. each for whites and each 9 Natives. E.C. to be erected on site. A daily pail removal service to be given free of cost.
 - (c) The local authority to provide suitable sleeping accommodation for the Native employees who will not exceed 28 (twenty eight) in number.
 - (d) The local authority must provide an adequate supply of water for the works and for drinking purposes at the brickmaking site.
