NOTE TO SUPPORTERS

INFORMATION FOR AUTHORS

To better assist the editorial team with the task of compiling the SAJAH in good time, in future, all contributors are requested to produce their manuscripts in the same format as has been set out in this edition, viz.: In two columns, with a left margin of 3 cm; a right margin of 3 cm; a top margin of 2.5 cm; and a bottom margin of 1 cm.

Each article must contain an abstract, written in English but preferably with a translation in Afrikaans. This should be in Times New Roman font size 10. The main body of the text should be in Arial font size 11. The endnotes, which should immediately follow the main

body of text, should be in Times New Roman font size 9. Finally, the source list should be in Times New Roman font size 10.

For the sake of conformity, in future, authors are requested to adhere to the conventions of the A.P.A. referencing system and to use English spelling conventions. Latin and other non-English terms are to be in italics. Quotations in the text should make use of double quotation marks (i.e. "), whereas quotations within quotations should make use of single quotation marks (i.e. ').

Images (which are referred to as "figures") should only be included if they are absolutely germane to the article. Authors who have the facilities should scan their images in gray-scale at 100 ppi and then reduce them such that they are exactly 300 picsels in width. They may be any height, so long as this does not exceed the length of the page. These may be included in the text at the time of submission. Contributors who do not have the resources should ensure that they send good quality original photographs, with clear instructions as to their position in the text. These will be scanned by the editorial team.

All submissions should be printed out in hard copy format for the benefit of the academic referee. Should the article be approved for publication, the author should then submit a digital version in MS Word (.doc) format on a double-sided, high-density 3.5-inch diskette (stiffy disk) or CD ROM disk.
