

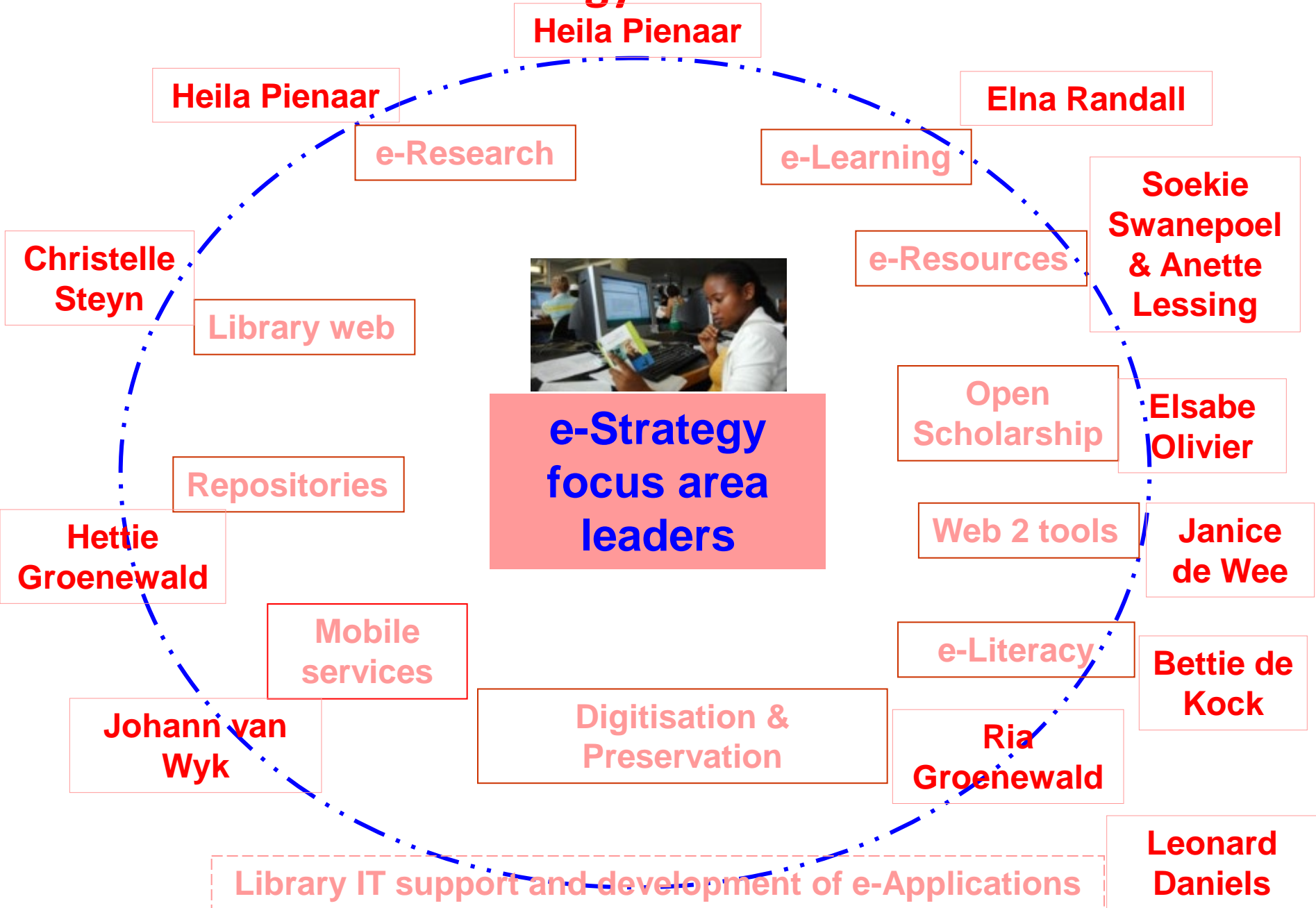

Introduction

- Main event of 2012 was the e-Strategy Marketing and Training Event that was held in September. Marketed as 'Out of the e-Box' symposium and training workshops.



- Overdrive (e-Fiction) investigation, implementation, training and marketing can be seen as another important corporate e-Initiative

 - Huge effort to appoint a ‘UP research data manager’ – not successful
 - Workshop during e-Strategy event (dr Lucia Lotter)
 - ‘Project outline for the implementation of research data management at UP’ dated Nov 2012 (HP).
 - Johann van Wyk to start at e-Service in 2013 and support project in collaboration with HP.
- Virtual Research Environment (VRE):
 - Part of Isak van der Walt’s role: developed a literature database for UP academic & formally took over the Moodle VRE maintenance contract
 - Paper on VRE’s at SA online user group conference (HP)

- Presented a paper on current game at SA online user group conference
- A New “credit card” was created for 1st year students
- Training tutorial 2013 is in place
- Anti plagiarism, Endnote and Refworks training are in place
- Overdrive marketing was successful, training will be included in 2013 library training
- Upgrade assignment support page
- Turnitin marketing and information sessions are necessary and in place.

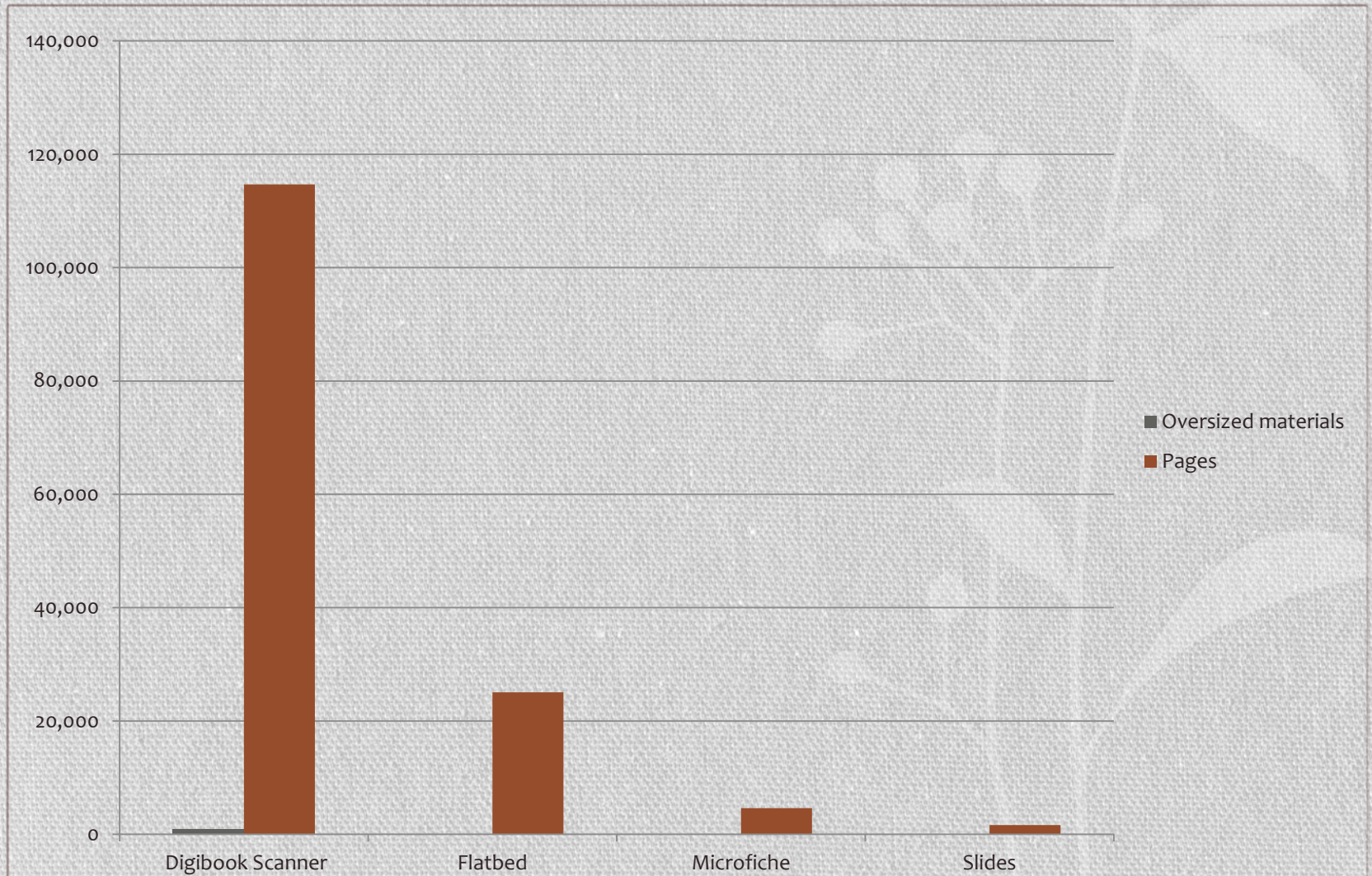

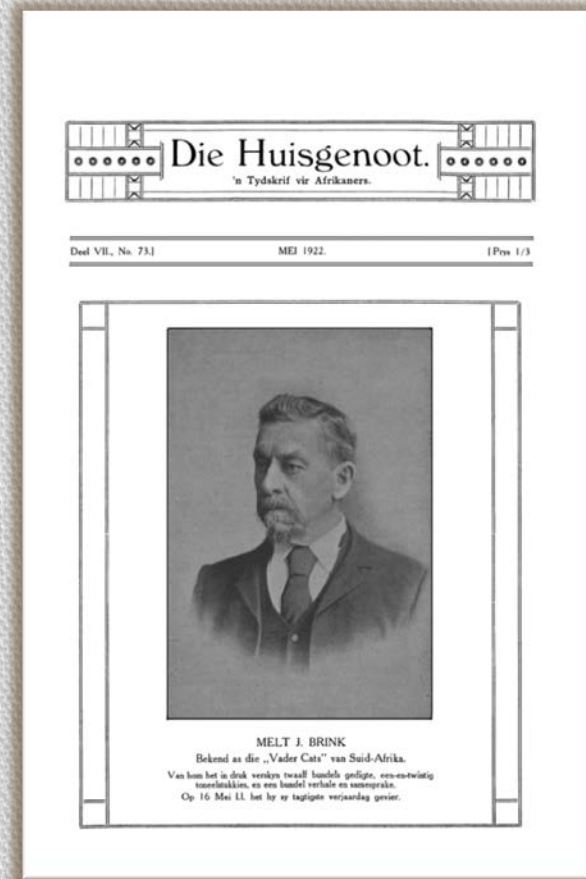


Huisgenoot project (Mei 1922)

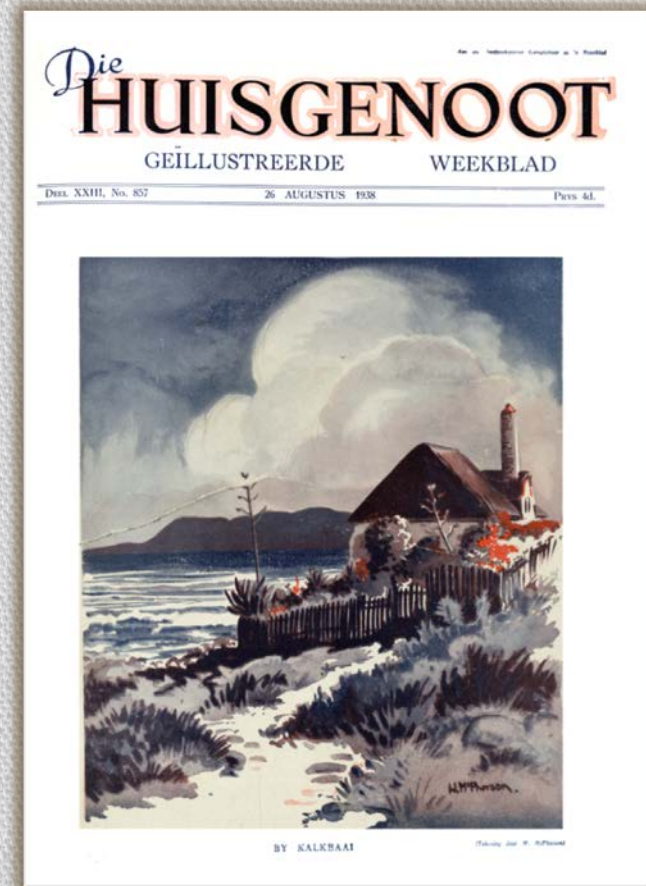


Huisgenoot project (Augustus 1938)

Conclusion

- In the beginning of 2012 the Library IT section became part of the 'Innovation & Technology' division. This was an important step as dedicated IT expertise could now be integrated into the e-Strategy
- During 2012 the e-Literacy and Library Catalogue managers also joined the e-Service unit and their skills are an added bonus for the e-Strategy
- Most of the e-Strategy focus areas staff are now on level 2 and it has improved the collaboration between the different areas tremendously!
- Focus area leaders from Client Services and Library Technical Services continued to add value to the e-Strategy
- The biggest focus in 2012 was mobile developments (although quite ad hoc!) and this will also receive attention in 2013.
