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

## Appendix 2: The Primal Beginning or *t'ai chi t'u* \*



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

### Appendix 3: Diagram of *Ho T'u*, the Yellow River Map




Sequence of Earlier Heaven, or Primal Arrangement


## Appendix 5: Diagram of *Lo Shu*, the Writing from the River Lo




## Appendix 6: A Mind Map of the Chinese writing system as illustrated by the Array typing method\*
