

The plans for Johannesburg's new railway, station, drawn by Mr. McCubbin, the chief architect of the Railway 'Administration in association with Messrs, Gordon Leith and Gerald Moerdub, were displayed to the Minister of Railways and the Railway Board in Capetoun last speek and met with general approval. The great central gateway stretching across the end of Eloff Street, with massive columns and two large black elephants, was much admired. The architectural treatment of the main building has been designed consistently with a view to economy both of cost and maintenance, and uet at the same time not to be out of harmony with the adjacent railway " offices. The main building will give a very fine appearance to the end of Eloff Street, the imposing gateway being the full width of the thoroughtare.



The new building has been designed

to occupy the site bounded on the north by Noord Street, on the south by De

Villiers Street, east by Hock Street

and west by Joubert Street, and thus

is a detached block, so planned as to

enable access and egress on the north

and south sides for passengers, while

the east and west sides accommodate the parcels and baggage avadrangles

respectively. The main axis of the

building is the centre of Eloff Street

and the main entrance and exit for

pedestrian passengers is situated upon

the axis, thus terminating one of the

main streets of the town in a fitting

The Town Council are at present considering the proposal to close to

pehicular traffic that portion of De

Villiers Street between the east side of

Eloff Street and Jouhert Street to

enable pedestrians to enter and leave

the station without having to traverse a flow of traffic at right angles to the

normal direction of the pedestrian

gateway

traffic.

The Concourse: View from inside looking towards Eloff Street. Although placed twelve feet below normal ground level, it will be well lighted. Refreshment and dining rooms, telephone call offices, and stalls for the sale of fruit and confectionery will be placed round the Concourse. Part of the floor will be occupied by the Catering
