
Preface

- UPSpace is UP's digital repository system
- Officially deployed in February 2006
- UPSpace manages and disseminates digital research materials of UP community members
- This includes the collection, storage & preservation of items
- Organized around communities
 - Communities (e.g. Education)
 - Sub-Communities (e.g. Education Management and Policy Studies)
 - Collections (e.g. Jonathan Jansen Collection)



The Jonathan Jansen Collection

- Dean of the Faculty of Education
- Eminent scholar & academic
- Since 2000: published 42 journal articles
- 2005: 22 media columns in 2005
- "I want a webpage"
- November showcased UPSpace
- Started uploading immediately





Problems & pitfalls

- Collection Policy
 - Collection Administrator
 - Description of content (Rejected personalised, nonacademic items, attacks on persons, administrative concerns)
- Submitting items to a Collection
 - Standardisation (file names, Harvard citations, Subject list etc.)
- Permission barriers
 - SHERPA publisher copyright policies & self-archiving: http://www.sherpa.ac.uk/romeo.php
 - Publisher's copy may not be used
 - SAMedia




Pleasures & profits

- Most importantly: open access accessible & searchable

 - Central archive of his work
 - Increases visibility, prestige, usage and impact

 - Wealth of knowledge is made available
- Benefits for scholars
 - Free, unrestricted access

 - Convenient, retrievable








Home page of the Jonathan Jansen Collection







The full text of a speech






Media columns sorted by date

Future prospects

- Identify members & convince faculty to participate
- Play a role in the reform of the Scholarly communication system

Postscript

"This project has transformed my life as a Dean in three ways." First, it made me aware of the power of technology in managing the multiplicity of written tasks—media articles, media interviews, newspaper columns, intellectual pieces that simply drift into spaces where I can never find these original writings. Second, it made me aware of the efficiency of dissemination of ideas in this information age if one simply took the time to create such a web space.
