For some time past, the work of the Church at this centre (Thirty Four Rivers and neighborhood) has been left almost entirely in the hands of the few very poor Churchmen who live in this district. They have carried on their responsibility in a most noble manner, and have held regular services at one of the few houses every Sunday and Holy Days.

The priest in charge, (the Rev. G.M. Stewart) has been able, at last, to institute more regular and frequent services. During the last week a meeting was held to consider ways in which it could be made possible and desirable to maintain a school, which has been provided for some considerable time, and the way of building a well fitted school in the town of Thirty Four Rivers.

And for the sake of the children of this town they generously gave by Miss Stewart.

At a meeting it was agreed that a school should be built and a committee was formed for the purpose of collecting funds from the Churchmen at Thirty Four Rivers, and their personal friends in England.
