SOGA, JOTELLO FESTIRI (1865, Transkei, South Africa – December 6, 1906, East London, South Africa). *Veterinarian*. Son of Rev. Tiyo Soga and Janet Soga (neé Burnside). Married Catherine Watson Chalmers, 1892.

EDUCATION: Royal (Dick) Veterinary College: 1886, graduated MRCVS.

CAREER: Practised veterinary medicine: 1886 – 1889, Cape Colony; colonial junior veterinarian, Cape Colony: 1889 – 1894; district veterinarian, Cape Colony: 1894 – 1895; assistant veterinary surgeon, Cape Colony, 1896 – 1899; practised veterinary medicine and farm supervisor, Cape Colony: 1899 – 1906.

CONTRIBUTIONS: First South African born citizen to qualify as veterinary surgeon; with Hutcheon a major role-player in combating rinderpest in Cape Colony and Bechuanaland Protectorate; proved that krimpsiekte (nenta) of sheep and goats is caused by the plant *Tylecodon ventricosus*; investigated medicinal properties of South African plants in poinering studies with Professor A Smith; involved in early vaccination campaign against contagious bovine pleuropneumonia in Cape Colony; founder member of Cape of Good Hope Veterinary Medical Society; particularly noteworthy was that he managed to achieve despite having to work in an official and social racist environment.

HOMAGES AND DISTINCTIONS: Commended by British High Commissioner, Lord Alfred Milner, for special services in Bechuanaland Protectorate to combat rinderpest.
