South African Strategic Context: PG Training

Wits operates, within the South African higher education and research landscape, which is framed by a number of key national strategies, i.e. the National Development Plan (NDP) which calls upon the country's higher education sector to deliver the following by 2030:

- ☐ An increase in the proportion of academic staff with a PhD to 75% of the total;
- An improvement in the quality of teaching and learning;
- An increase in the participation rate so that the total enrolments amount to 1.62m;
- An increase in the throughput rate to more than 75% (or the graduation rate to more than 25%) of students;
- An increase in the number of PG students to 25% of total enrolments;
- ☐ The graduation of more than 100 doctoral graduates per million of total population;
- A doubling and commensurate increase in the number of women and black postgraduates graduating with science degrees.

WITS Postgraduate Training Strategy

- Strategic Framework for Postgraduate (PG) Research Support is a strategy of the University of Witwatersrand, Johannesburg and its internal directorates – DRI, Postgraduate Studies Department, Faculties and WITS libraries
- ☐ The purpose of the **Research Support Framework** is to provide aspirational goals and associated services that will shape and direct investment and activities across the University in the field of PG research and training
- ☐ The 2023- 2027 Strategic Plan for PG Research Training was developed under the umbrella of the Wits Vision 2023 Strategic Framework that positions the University at the "leading edge of the Global South" (Wits, 2022).




The Wits University Context: Postgraduates

- ☐ Students are the lifeblood of a university and form its most precious intellectual pipeline
- ☐ The University has committed to increasing the quantity and quality of its research and postgraduates since identifying itself as "research intensive" at the turn of the century
- ☐ Inherent in the notion of research intensity is that research is strongly enabled by the PG cohort of the University and indeed that research and PG training are two sides of the same coin, in the knowledge economy



WITS Libraries PG Research Support Framework








Graduates/Researchers of the Future

Building a Pipeline for Academic Excellence





Objective 1

Establish regular and formal co-operation with the Department of Research to achieve a common understanding on Scholarly Communication services and development of institutional research support capacity in particular:-

- ☐ To clarify roles of the Library, the Postgraduate Studies Department & Faculty in support to Postgraduate students, and to <u>identify areas of intense collaboration between the main stakeholders</u>
- ☐ To get the Department of Research involved in spearheading the process of bringing all stakeholders on board
- ☐ To familiarise students with the university's expectations for postgraduate studies and the kinds of attributes that it intends to develop in its postgraduate students
- ☐ To promote academic and social integration into the university and cultivate a sense of belonging and community among students that includes commitments to regional and international inclusivity

Objective 2

Build an advanced research capacity and encourage the creation of an inclusive research culture amongst new first year M & D students which is central to the postgraduate strategy of the University


- To help new postgraduate students from a range of different undergraduate programmes and backgrounds experience a near seamless transition from undergraduate to postgraduate studies
- To familiarise students with the physical and virtual libraries, the range of research resources available and research support services as required
- To help students make a strong start to their postgraduate studies by providing foundational structured academic/research support, both content and skills development

- Our holdings contain the collections of NGOs, trade unions, political parties, women's organizations, large volume of political trials, the personal papers of human rights activists, artists, photographers and other cultural workers, sports, civil society movements and organizations.
- Sensitive archives from the Apartheid era
- As an archival institution we serve civil society to transform archives into accessible and transparent institutions.




SAHA AS ACTIVIST ARCHIVE

- 5. Raise awareness of the role of archives and documentation in promoting and defending human rights.


