

# In Memoriam

## Dr Jan Hendrik du Preez



Ek wil graag van hierdie geleentheid gebruik maak om 'n huldeblyk aan Dr Jan Hendrik du Preez te bring vir sy buitengewone bydraes tot die veld van veterinêre wetenskap, veral in die areas van volksgesondheid, soönooses en die suiwelindustrie.

Dr Jan het nie net met passie en trots Afrikaans omhels nie, hy het ook 'n onverskrokke toewyding aan wetenskaplike navorsing nagestreef. Met trots kan ek verwys na sy indrukwekkende prestasies. Dr Jan het 'n MMedVet(Hyg)-graad verwerf en geregistreer as 'n Veterinêre Spesialis Volksgesondheid, met belangrike navorsing bydraes soos "Die Aard en Betekenis van Anaërobe Bakteriëë in die Melkkoei-uier". In 1972 regstreer hy as lid van die "Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons" in Groot-Brittannie.

Hy het verwerf nie net een nie maar twee nagraadse diplomas en sy studies word bekroon met 'n Doktorsgraad in Veeartsenykunde (DVSc) in 1985, en later,

in 1994, 'n PhD in Veeartsenykunde. Sy ondersoek na die troika-impak op Suid-Afrika se melkbedryf, insluitend ensoötiese beesleukose, hittestres, en mastitis, het nie net die wetenskap bevorder nie, maar het ook 'n uiterse relevante implikasie vir die suiwelbedryf se ekonomie. Die wyse waarop hy die impak van klimaatsverandering en hitte op melkbeeste beskryf het, het 'n duidelike en insiggewende prentjie geskep van die uitdagings wat die bedryf in die gesig staar.

Dr Jan se loopbaan is 'n indrukwekkende een, met 'n wye verskeidenheid van ervarings, insluitend sy betrokkenheid as senior lektor en professor aan die Universiteit van Pretoria, direkteur van die Melkproduente Organisasie van Suid-Afrika, en besturende direkteur van die Instituut van Suiweltegnologie. Met meer as 53 wetenskaplike en 600 semi-wetenskaplike artikels, asook 17 boeke op sy naam, is dit duidelik dat hy nie net 'n kenner op sy vakgebied is nie, maar ook 'n vurige voorstander vir die deel van kennis en inligting met die gemeenskap. Dr Jan se navorsing op soönooses, uiergesondheid, en die uitkennings van beessiektes het die pad gebaan vir verdere begrip en bestuur van hierdie kwessies. Sy impak is nie beperk tot akademiese prestasies en publikasies nie, maar ook op die gemeenskap deur die stigting van die eerste private Instituut vir Suiweltegnologie (IST) in Afrika. Hy het opleiding, inligting, en kursusse aangebied aan 'n groot aantal melkboere en plaaswerkers, en dit het ongetwyfeld 'n betekenisvolle bydrae gelewer tot die sukses van die bedryf.

Dr Jan het nie net 'n impak op die wetenskap gemaak nie, maar hy het ook die emosionele welstand van boere aangespreek deur die fokus op volhoubare landbou en welsynskepping in sy boeke.

Dr. Jan du Preez, jy het nie net 'n voetspoor in die veld van veterinêre wetenskap gelaat nie, maar jy het ook 'n belangrike bydrae gelewer tot die groei en volhoubaarheid van die suiwelbedryf in Suid-Afrika. Jou toewyding en deernis is merkbaar, en ons is dankbaar vir die impak wat jy in ons lewens gemaak het.

'n Paar van jou sê goed wat ek nooit sal vergeet nie is:

- 'Soms is die golwe hoog en soms is die golwe laag, ons is nie bang nie'
- 'As jy nie verander nie sal nikks om jou verander nie'
- 'Hoe meer jy leer hoe meer besef jy hoe min weet jy'

Afford me this opportunity to honour Dr Jan Hendrik du Preez for the extraordinary contributions he made to science, particularly in the areas of community health, zoonoses and the dairy industry.

Dr Jan not only embraced the Afrikaans language with passion but was also vigorously dedicated to scientific research. I can proudly refer to his many academic achievements. He graduated from Onderstepoort as a Veterinarian in 1971 and continued to acquire the MMedVet(Hyg) in 1981 after which he registered as a Veterinary Community Health Specialist with his important research contribution "The Nature and Significance of Anaerobic Bacteria in the Cow Udder". He proceeded to achieve not one but two post-graduate diplomas and his

studies were awarded with a Doctorate in Veterinary Science and later, in 1994 a PhD in Veterinary Ethology. Dr Jan's scrutiny of the heat stress, mastitis and bovine enzootic leukosis troika's impact on the dairy industry of South Africa not only furthered science but had a very positive effect on the dairy industry's economy. How he described the impact of climate change and heat created a clear picture of the challenges in store for the industry.

Dr Jan was involved as a senior lecturer and professor at the University of Pretoria. He was the Director of the Milk Production Organisation of South Africa and well as the Managing Director of the Institute of Dairy Technology. His research and practical knowledge in Zoonoses, udder health and the identification of diseases in cows lead the way to a better understanding and management of these issues. With more than 53 scientific articles, 600 semi-scientific articles and 17 books that flowed from his pen, it is clear that he not only had great knowledge in his field of expertise but he also had a

passion for sharing the knowledge with the greater community. His impact was not limited to academic achievements or publications but also the community by founding the first private Institute for Dairy Technology in Africa. He presented training and courses to a large number of farmers and farm staff which undoubtedly led to the betterment of the industry. Through his books, he also offered emotional support to farmers by focusing on sustainable agriculture and the creation of wealth.

Dr Jan du Preez, you not only left a big footprint in Veterinary Medicine but also contributed greatly to the growth and sustainability of the Dairy Industry in South Africa.

Your dedication and compassion will be missed dearly and we are grateful for your impact on our lives.
