Wildlife clinics to the rescue: The Hospital recently had to attend to a mass poisoning of vultures. The animals were transported from the Mpumalanga province. Our dedicated staff and students on the wildlife rotation were able to receive 18 vultures after midnight, and went the extra-mile to provide the necessary care.... and by

morning, they had successfully pulled them through, and in the process marshalled a number of the hospital's mobile dog cages to house that many vultures. To quote one of the volunteers (a senior attorney) who brought in the birds "*I want to extend a sincere compliment to Sr Lllamani.... It was clear that the birds' comfort and wellbeing was important to him.*"

Outside the Box

- Faculty Funding: As mentioned in the previous edition, we have been in discussion with the DHET to look at Faculty funding. The Deanery is currently busy with 3 National Skills Fund applications to source more funding for the Faculty. We've also submitted a new application to the HWSETA for WIL funding for all our final year students.
- Faculty Evaluation: The Faculty will be going through the University's quinquennial review in April next year. The process of collating an SER has begun. The Faculty will need to nominate senior academics from international veterinary schools to participate in the evalutation. If you have any suggestions, please feel free to send us some names.

Imploding the Box

Partnerships: The startup company Easichicken has approached the Faculty as a potential research partner in Public Health and Biosecurity. The company has permission from DALRRD to sell mobile chicken abattoirs. They want to operate a business model where smallscale producers partner in groups of 10 and buy a unit. They are looking to the Faculty for research support in terms of evaluating effectiveness, veterinary health aspects, biosecurity and potential for carcass contaminations.

Student Electives: The Faculty is investigating the potential options for private practices to be more involved in final year student training. The (Tygerberg) Animal Hospital (TAH) group has shown interest in offering opportunities for our students to rotate throughout their various facilities.

- Animal Protections Act: The Department of Agriculture will be embarking on the major task of repealing the Animal Protection Act. They're looking into creating a more proactive legislation that will advise on how to care for animals as opposed to only stipulating penalties for welfare concerns. They envision the new Act to cater for animal research as well. They have approached the Faculty to become involved in the process. This is a great initiative and one we think the Faculty should support. As soon they're ready to start, we'll be hosting them for a most open discussion with staff who would be interested in assisting.
- Farming for our own food: Black Inc Gary Taylor, a philanthropist, has obtained the rights to use the wedge of land adjacent to the Faculty, and has agreed to allow us to use the land. While we cannot afford to fence the area for pastures, the Faculty with NAS Faculty can now consider plans to establish pastures for harvest so that we can grow our own good quality feed.
