- Clinical Positions: Through the hard work of both our acting HODs in CACS and PAS, we are slowly managing to recruit veterinarians into clinical positions into the departments and the OVAH. While we have seen many faces change at the faculty, we are also happy to welcome our next generation of academics and veterinary specialists into the faculty.
- Stakeholder Engagements: The faculty advisory board had their annual meeting recently. The discussions were very positives with good suggestions on how the faculty can move forward. One of the requests has been to bring back OPNews as an alumni magazine so that our alumni can feel part of the faculty. Please look out for the first issue of the magazine.
- UP Academic Achievers Awards: UP recently hosted the academic achievement awards for staff who recently received their NRF rating or renewals of ratings. Congratulations to staff who have been recently rated. The faculty would like to encourage all staff, academic, extra-ordinary or professional, who meet the NRF requirements to apply for their ratings.
- Chinese Embassy: The faculty hosted a delegation from the Chinese embassy. The Chinese government has made available funds for rural development, and the team was exploring opportunities of working with the faculty in the field of primary animal health, following a recent media publication covering training activities being undertaken with PAS and E@UP.

Imploding the Box

Veterinary Act: We have been informed that the veterinary council has requested permission to make changes to the veterinary act. We await feedback on the decision from the minister's office and any consultation process that may follow.

Food poisonings in the country: A very concerning problem has emerged in the country with contaminated food being sold by vendors. Based on our expertise in food hygiene and toxicology, we would like to see staff also playing a role in future proactive management. We would thus like to encourage staff to get involved if offered the opportunity. A concern that is likely to come up next is the sale of poor quality eggs and

meat, especially with the emergence of antimicrobial resistant strains of

bacteria.

- OVAH Website: As mentioned in the previous issue, we are moving ahead with a new webpage for the OVAH. We are working towards appointing a marketing intern from January under the guidance of the UP marketing team at Institutional Advancement.
- Post-grad student recruitment: Being a comprehensive veterinary school, in addition to recruiting undergraduate students we need to be active in recruiting BSc Hons students into our research Masters' programmes. Without our own honours pipeline, we'll be piloting a project next year whereby we'll be hosting 10 UNISA honours students in campus laboratories to see if this could be a valuable recruitment tool.
