Research visibility, publishing and SDGs: the interactive trio by Myleen Oosthuizen

Aligning with the UP vision of internationalization of the university's research profile, and the Department of Library Science (DLS) support of the open science initiative and open access publishing, the Jotello F Soga Library planning for 2024 includes activities to increase researcher visibility.


A flagship goal for the DLS is to enhance research output and visibility by linking publications and activities to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. Linking SDGs to research, increase citations and visibility which in turn impact on university rankings. SDG impact is added to the QS World University Rankings and the Times Higher Education (THE) Impact Rankings. UP is climbing the rankings with a 42nd place in the world in 2024 based on THE rankings, reaching the top 50. (UP News, 14 June 2024)

The work of Amelia Breytenbach, a retired librarian of the Jotello F Soga Library, was used as the pilot study for the DLS project. The Veterinary Science SDG subject guide is created to highlight the faculty's contributions to the 17 sustainable development goals through their research and activities. This SDG subject guide will form the basis for all faculties to enhance the University of Pretoria's commitment to end poverty, protect the planet and improve the lives and prospects of everyone, everywhere.

Marketing events will take place throughout 2024 to increase awareness among researchers to link their research to the sustainable development goals. A webinar on SDGs and the creation of the SDG search platform was presented by Marguerite Nel during the DLS Research Week that took place from 22 – 26 April 2024. The DLS is hosting the South African SDG Hub.

Report on basic SPSS workshop

The basic IBM SPSS training session took place on Saturday, 22nd of June 2024 at the Onderstepoort campus, in the boardroom on Level 2 of the Arnold Theiler Building. The session was facilitated by Lehogolono Tabana and Meisie Rasakanya, both from the Hatfield campus. Meisie presented on the theoretical aspects of IBM SPSS statistics, providing a comprehensive overview of its functionalities and applications. Lehlogonolo demonstrated the practical aspects, including creating and editing data files on IBM SPSS, navigating the variable view screen, and the use and benefits of filters. Lehlogonolo was assisted by Research Commons personnel Khomotso, Naledi, Lesego, and Meisie.

Practical examples were used throughout the presentation, allowing students to engage actively by analysing provided data sets. Participants were able to generate data in terms of frequencies, percentages, and graphs from their analyses. This hands-on approach facilitated a deeper understanding of the software's capabilities.

Overall, the session was a success, with 21 postgraduate students participating and engaging with the presenters. The session was organized by Myleen Oosthuizen, the library manager, who also provided refreshments for the participants. We would also like to extend our gratitude to Lesego and the team from Hatfield Research Commons for their support during the training session, and to everyone who attended.

Ready to Reno: update on Jotello Library renovations by Myleen Oosthuizen

How time flies – it is already a year since our 2023 update on the renovation project.

Since I started in Susan Marsh's position as manager of the Jotello F Soga Library in December 2022, the renovation of level five, was a lively discussion. The moving of all the Veterinary journals to the off-campus storage space at Groenkloof (then still under investigation) was completed mid-2023. We planned (as only library personnel can do) and moved the print book collection from level five to level four by end 2023. The huge reserved collection was integrated with the books on level four, leaving much space for renovation. Ernest Sefolo, our cataloguer, did a great job by writing off all the weeded books after evaluation and removal of the duplicates. In January 2024 we open the written off books to departments to visit the library, choose and take books, which are less traumatic than sending them to the paper bins. We were surprised as almost all books were grabbed up by staff and students without the necessity to call on the waste paper collectors!

Jotello F Soga is now ready for the next phase and awaiting Faculty to schedule the architect for a follow-up visit to make changes and integrate the plans with a master plan for the whole library.
