Abstract: Objective: To determine the persistence of Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) into adulthood in parents of children diagnosed with ADHD and currently attending child and adolescent psychiatric clinics (located at a tertiary academic hospital and a community based clinic). Method: A structured questionnaire was completed by 58 parents of ADHD children. Those parents identified as having childhood ADHD were further required to complete a screening questionnaire for adult ADHD. Results: 37.9% (22) of the 58 participants were found to have had childhood ADHD. Of these 22 participants 36.4% (8) were still found to have symptoms suggestive of ADHD. Conclusion: Childhood ADHD has been reconceptualised as a lifespan disorder. Our study was in keeping with other studies showing a persistence of ADHD symptoms into adulthood.

Steps to Becoming a Data Contributor

To become a data contributor-- in the Open Archives Initiative this is known as a Data Provider-- you should follow a few simple seteps.

- Familiarize yourself with [the OAI Protocol for Metadata Harvesting](#), available at the Open Archives Initiative site.
- Choose a tool to make your metadata available to harvesters such as OAister. The most comprehensive list of tools is the [Tools and Strategies for Using and Enhancing / Extending the OAI Protocol](#).
- Create your XML1.1 compatible, UTF-8 compliant metadata records. In order to be an OAI Data Provider, you must have your metadata available in [Simple Dublin Core metadata format](#). However, we encourage you to also make your metadata records available in other formats.
- Test your resulting repository of metadata records in the [OAI Repository Explorer](#).
- Register your repository with the [official Open Archives registry](#). As part of registration, the repository will need to pass a number of tests, not all of which are the same as those in the OAI Repository Explorer.
- Send Tom Habing an email (thabing@uiuc.edu) so he can add you to the [UIUC OAI registry](#). This is a comprehensive list of all OAI data providers.
- Send OAister an email (oaister@umich.edu) so we can harvest you immediately. If we spot any problems with your compliance (protocol or metadata), we will let you know.

Arnold Theiler

Sir Arnold Theiler (March 26, 1867 – July 24, 1936) the father of [veterinary science](#) in [South Africa](#). Born in [Frick](#), Canton Argau, [Switzerland](#). He received his higher education, and later qualified as a veterinarian in [Zurich](#). In 1891 Theiler travelled to South Africa and at first found employment as a farm worker on Irene Estates near Pretoria, owned by [Nelmapius](#), but later that year started practising as a vet.

His success at producing a vaccine to combat an outbreak of [smallpox](#) among the miners of the [Witwatersrand](#), brought him an appointment as state veterinarian for the [Zuid-Afrikaansche Republiek](#), in which capacity he served during the [Anglo-Boer War](#) of 1899-1902. During this period his research team developed a vaccine against [rinderpest](#), a malignant and contagious disease of cattle. His tremendous energy, pioneering spirit and professional integrity brought him international recognition.

Theiler was the first Director of the [Onderstepoort Veterinary Research Institute](#) outside [Pretoria](#). This institute under his leadership carried out research on [African horse sickness](#), [sleeping sickness](#), [malaria](#), East Coast fever (*Theileria parva*) and tick-borne diseases such as redwater, heartwater and [biliary](#). A Faculty of Veterinary Science was established here in 1920 which enabled vets to train locally for the first time. Theiler became the first dean of this faculty.

He married Emma Sophie Jegge (1861-1951) and had two sons and two daughters. Hans (1894-1947) a veterinarian, Margaret (1896-1988), a teacher. Two of the children worked at Onderstepoort - Gertrude (1897-1986) and [Max Theiler](#), a Nobel laureate in 1951 in Physiology and Medicine. [Visit the Arnold Theiler Collection on UPSpace.](#)





Hi Everyone,

You may already know this but we have discovered automated search linking in DSpace and it is buying us lots of accolades with management and research staff. Thought you may also want to make use of the facility if you are not doing so already.

Automated search linking works like this: you conduct a search in DSpace, for example, for an author Brown, Jack and get the result. You copy the URL (from/on the results page) and hard code it into Jack Brown's CV or personal web page as, for example, *Publications*. Whenever someone then clicks on *Publications* the link goes back to DSpace conducts the search and returns an updated results page listing all the author's documents.

The same thing can be done at community level. We are inserting a 'Publications' link on the Internet home pages of each of our research units which then links back to their communities in the CSIR ResearchSpace (this is what we are calling our DSpace). This means their publications list will automatically be updated as we update Research Space. and we are happy because it should encourage all to provide us with their publications!

All of this is still behind our fire wall because the new CSIR Internet site as well as ResearchSpace will only be launched on 1 August. We are however starting to test ResearchSpace outside the firewall later today/early tomorrow.

You are welcome to search for [www.http://researchspace.csir.co.za](http://researchspace.csir.co.za) and let us know if you find any hiccups that we should fix before the formal launch.
