

Voortrekker Monument Committee "Let Down"

Ladysmith, Tuesday.

AT a meeting of the Ladysmith Voortrekkers' Monument Committee, Mr. J. W. Sinclair moved that the committee be dissolved.

He stated that a definite assurance had been given that the site of the monument would be decided by equal representation from each province but that, when a decision was taken at Pretoria the central committee sat and voted with the delegates.

"We have definitely been let down and our delegates were not given a square deal," he said.

This motion was seconded by Dr Naude, who said he was finished with the committee. "The Pretoria Monument will not be a monument to the Voortrekkers but to the architect," he said.

An amendment was put forward that the matter be dropped until Mr. E. G. Jansen visited Ladysmith on November 15. This was carried.—Reuter.
