

~~JOHANNESBURG TO~~ HAVE NEW STATION

STANDERTON (Special Correspondence)—Johannesburg is to have a new and expensive railway station, befitting South Africa's largest and busiest town. Gerard Moerdyk is one of the architects to whom the designing of this station is intrusted. He is a young South African known to many folk as a designer of some fine public buildings, of beautiful old Dutch homes, and of distinctive Dutch Reformed churches.

It is generally agreed that his churches not only embody a truer sense of beauty than many of their predecessors, but they are a direct divergence in type from any previously recognized church architecture, while they do not lose sight of the Old Dutch ideal of the early settlers at the Cape.
