In 1994 - It all happened again. From Pretoria to Port Elizabeth, Pearl, Parys,
Ultarhage, Humansforp, Alexandra, Bleanfontein, Chadock, Tembise, Dureyton, Malkand, Nigel, Potchefstroom... students once again demonstrated their rejection of Apartheid inferior education. They demanded abolition of corporal punishment,
and Bloemfontein students wan their demands and in Pretoria, Cradock, Tembise and Deveyton the authorities refused to listen to the demands of the students.

Brutal and suppressive police actions left hundreds injured and four dead:
15 year old Bram Sathetage of Pretoria, 17 year old Schenzile Jacobs of Cradock, Johannes Mallo of Parys and a men in Malkan.






