SOME CREATIVE EXAMPLES OF INSTITUTIONAL REPOSITORIES WORLDWIDE Erica van der Westhuizen

On browsing the Web for interesting institutional repositories one can find some intriguing examples.

- Cornell University Historical Poultry Disease Laboratory Reports

These diagnostic books spanning 1920 -1988 consists of records of submissions to the Cornell Poultry Diagnostic Laboratories. Those records included name and address of the owner, brief history of the flock or farm and diagnosis of the problem. The books contain information of the problems observed in poultry. These records, along with the Annual Report of the New York State Veterinary College at Cornell University, provide information on the incidence and prevalence of poultry diseases.

What advantage is there to an author in depositing academic work in a university repository?

Academic work available on the internet is read more widely than work published in paper format. Also academic work which is available at little or no cost is read more widely than work published in expensive conventional publications. Depositing academic work in a university repository therefore increases the profile of an author on a world-wide basis, increasing both the dissemination and the impact of the research they undertake. Deposit in a university repository can also ease – both for the institution and for the academic author - the administrative burden of reporting publications for research assessment and review exercises. Regular submission of an author's work to a repository provides an author with a central archive of their work and a record of publications to add to a CV.

HOW TO FIND INFORMATION WHEN THE INTERNET IS DOWN Erica van der Westhuizen

Veterinary Bulletin:

Veterinary Bulletin is a print journal that publishes abstracts of the core literature in the whole field of animal health. It covers the full range of animals including cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, poultry, rabbits, cage birds, other small animals, laboratory animals, wild animals, zoo animals, fish, cats, dogs and other domestic animals.

Each week the online version of *Veterinary Bulletin* (the Veterinary Science Database) delivers all the new highly targeted, searchable summaries covering key English and non-English language journal articles, reports, conferences and books.

The print version is a monthly publication containing about 8,000 records per year, and includes indexes of authors, subjects, and serials cited. Review articles are a feature of the printed journal.



A companion volume is INDEX VETERINARIUS, but it is an index only, no abstracts are included. (Abstracts appear in Veterinary Bulletin).

Index Veterinarius is a comprehensive monthly subject and author index to the world's veterinary literature.

Aspects include anaesthesia metabolic disorders, anatomy, parasitology, animal behaviour, pharmacology and therapeutics, animal welfare, physiology, diagnostic techniques, reproductive disorders, haematology, surgery, husbandry, toxicology, immunology, zoonoses, meat inspection and hygiene.

As part of the centenary celebrations of the university, the Library Services presented a book festival from 5 to 8 March 2008. The festival, with a slogan *Leading Minds Read*, provided four days of reading pleasure: exploring new developments - especially in the field of eBooks, strolling between the stands in the exhibition hall and just chatting with friends, writers, publishers and other role players in the wonderful world of books and literature!

A one day symposium, *The eBook Phenomenon: a New Chapter,* took place on Friday, 7 March. Experts in the eBook domain discussed issues such as:

- The e-Book phenomenon and the way it will change learning, scholarship and our understanding and use of knowledge (Mark Carden)
- What's in a book an evolutionary journey from paper to electronic (Wouter van der Velde)
- e-Books Productivity booster or resource drain (Christopher James)
- Socially produced content and the Wisdom of the Crowds (Jenny Walker)
- Electronic dictionaries: where language meets (Wanda Smith-Muller)

Shimmer Chinodya, winner of the 2007/08 Noma Award for Publishing in Africa and who is featured in the online African Writer Series (ProQuest), talked about his work and the impact of being online. He also entertained the audience by reading from his work.

Different views and opinions were investigated during a very interesting and informative panel discussion on "The future of academic books".

A kaleidoscope of writers participated in the festivities. Sindiwe Magona, Darryl Accone, Helen Brain, Anzil Kulsen, Sarah Britten, Jaco Jacobs, Carina Diedericks-Hugo, Fanie Viljoen , Fred Khumalo and PG du Plessis were only some of the writers who took part in the events.

Approximately 1000 books whose authors have had some kind of association with the University, were on display in the Villa Museum as part of the BookJol. These works represented a century of academic endeavour, printing styles and layouts, cover designs, publishing trends and fluctuations in tertiary education. WHAT IS WEB 2.0 ?

"Web 2.0" recently became a buzz word in the computer environment. The phrase "Web 2.0" hints at an improved form of the World Wide Web but it does not refer to an update to any technical specifications. It rather refers to changes in the ways software developers and end-users use the Web.

Web 1.0 was static with read-only websites, whose content could only be modified by the site's owner. Visitors could only view but not touch it. Web 2.0 includes a social element where users generate and distribute content, often with freedom to share and re-use.

Web **2.0** is

- a trend in the use of World Wide Web technology
- web design that aims to facilitate creativity
- information sharing
- collaboration among users.

These concepts led to the development and evolution of web-based communities and hosted services, such as social-networking sites (facebook etc.), wikis, blogs, and folksonomies.

The Veterinary Science Library has already implemented some of these Web 2.0 tools and the staff are using them with great enthusiasm.
