


Open Access

Open access refers to research outputs which are distributed online and free of cost or other barriers, possibly with the addition of a Creative Commons license to promote reuse. Academic articles have been the main focus of the movement.




Percentage of Open Access publications in total publications, 2009-2018







maximised dissemination, economic efficiency & social impact








Accelerated scientific progress & maximised return on public investment.

Public granted reuse rights under open licenses.

Published versions of articles immediately accessible to public.

Authors may be required to pay publisher an 'article processing charge' to cover publishing costs.





Other models

Embargoed Access journals (yellow):

 free access to all articles after a specified embargo period and typically utilize conventional copyright statements

Partial Access journals (orange):

 free access to selected articles after a specified embargo period and typically utilize conventional copyright statements

Bronze OA

- Free to read on the publisher page
- Lack a clearly identifiable license

Diamond/platinum OA

- Publish open access without charging APCs
- Funding from external sources such as academic institutions, learned societies, philanthropists or government grants

Unauthorized digital copying

Free access to paywalled literature via existing social media sites (e.g. the ICanHazPDF hashtag) or other dedicated sites (e.g. Sci-Hub)



Purpose

To facilitate open access publishing of research articles by members of the University of Pretoria, in order to make the University's research more accessible, and increasing the visibility and impact of the research, for the benefit of both researchers and the University.



OA journals do not charge subscription fees but expect from authors (or their institutions) payment of a once-off Article Processing Charge (APC) before publication, in order for the article to be accessible to the end-user free of charge and indefinitely. It is generally accepted that open access publishing will become increasingly important as a mode of communication of research findings, and that authors should be encouraged and supported in using open access publishing.

Who may apply for refunding of APCs?



- Faculty academic staff and researchers
- Research fellows
- Post-doctoral fellows
- Postgraduate students publishing in collaboration with UP Faculty members



Eligibility of articles:

- Scholarly peer-reviewed articles which are published in accredited international journals listed on ISI (Web of Science) or IBSS (International Bibliography of the Social Sciences) and which qualify for subsidy from the Department of Higher Education and Training (DHET)
- Open Access journal listed in the Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ)
- Impact factor of the journal should adhere to the standard determined by the relevant faculty
- Exclude articles to be published in hybrid (open choice) journals
- Exclude book publications, monographs and book chapters
- Exclude articles which are already published
- Exclude articles for which alternative funding is available



Application and Funding process

- The Open Scholarship Office will contribute a portion (50% in general) of APCs levied by peer-reviewed (and accredited) Open Access journals meeting the necessary criteria, provided funds are available in the Open Access Fund
- Authors must cover the balance of the APC through grant or other funds, and should negotiate lower publishing fees when possible
- The request for funding should be made by the primary and corresponding author of the article
- Collaborative research:
 - co-authorship with international authors, the Fund will pay 60%
 - collaboration with authors from South African institutions –
 the researcher may only apply for their portion of the AP©

Application and Funding process

- Should apply for funding before submitting the article to a journal
- Authors will be required to ensure that:
 - All articles published indicate a University of Pretoria affiliation
 - A copy of the article is deposited in the UP institutional repository (IR)


The Open Scholarship Programme provides services that support the research-intensive needs of the research, teaching and learning communities at the University of Pretoria.

The following services are provided:


- the development and maintenance of the UPSpace institutional repository
