- “We want to be **challenged** and want to have access to technologies that will contribute towards **creative solutions for research problems.**”
- Cell phones, always-on, multi-tasking, expectation of fast delivery, self-service info, believe it’s all on the web, gaming, virtual realities, high transparency (Facebook, MySpace), online photo sharing, less TV more online news and blogs

Web 2.0 Phenomenon (incl. IR's)

- Users build networks (professional, recreational, etc.)

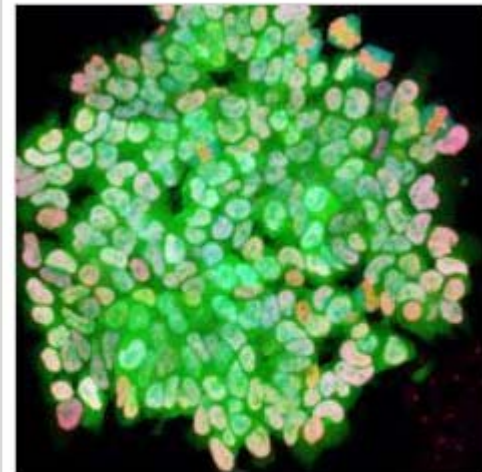

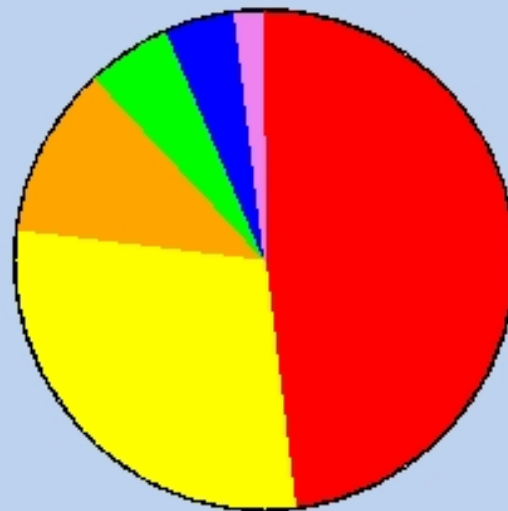

Worldwide



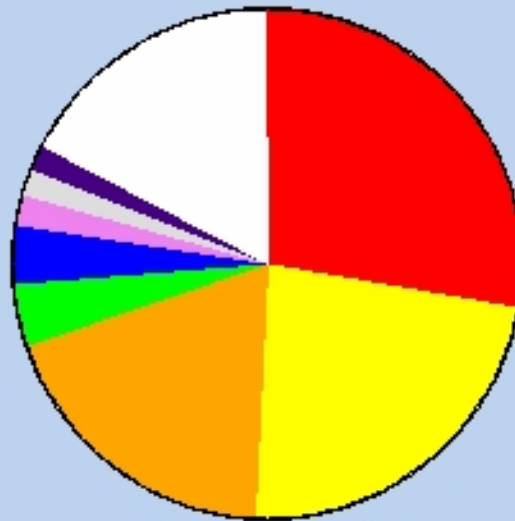

Worldwide



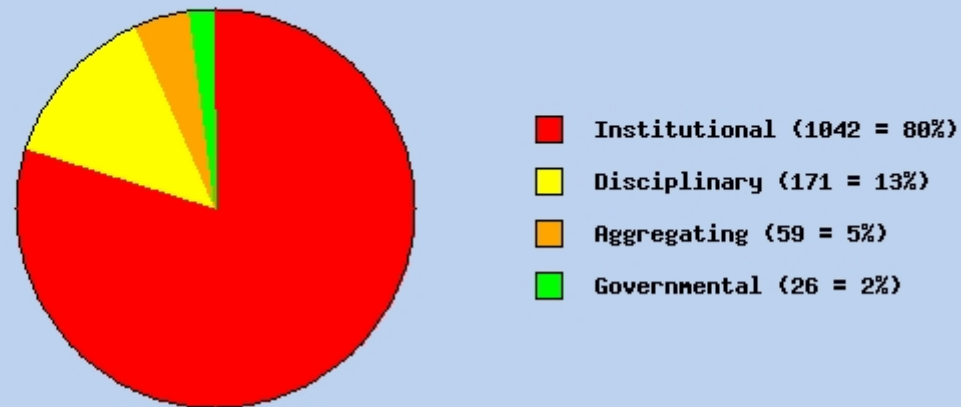

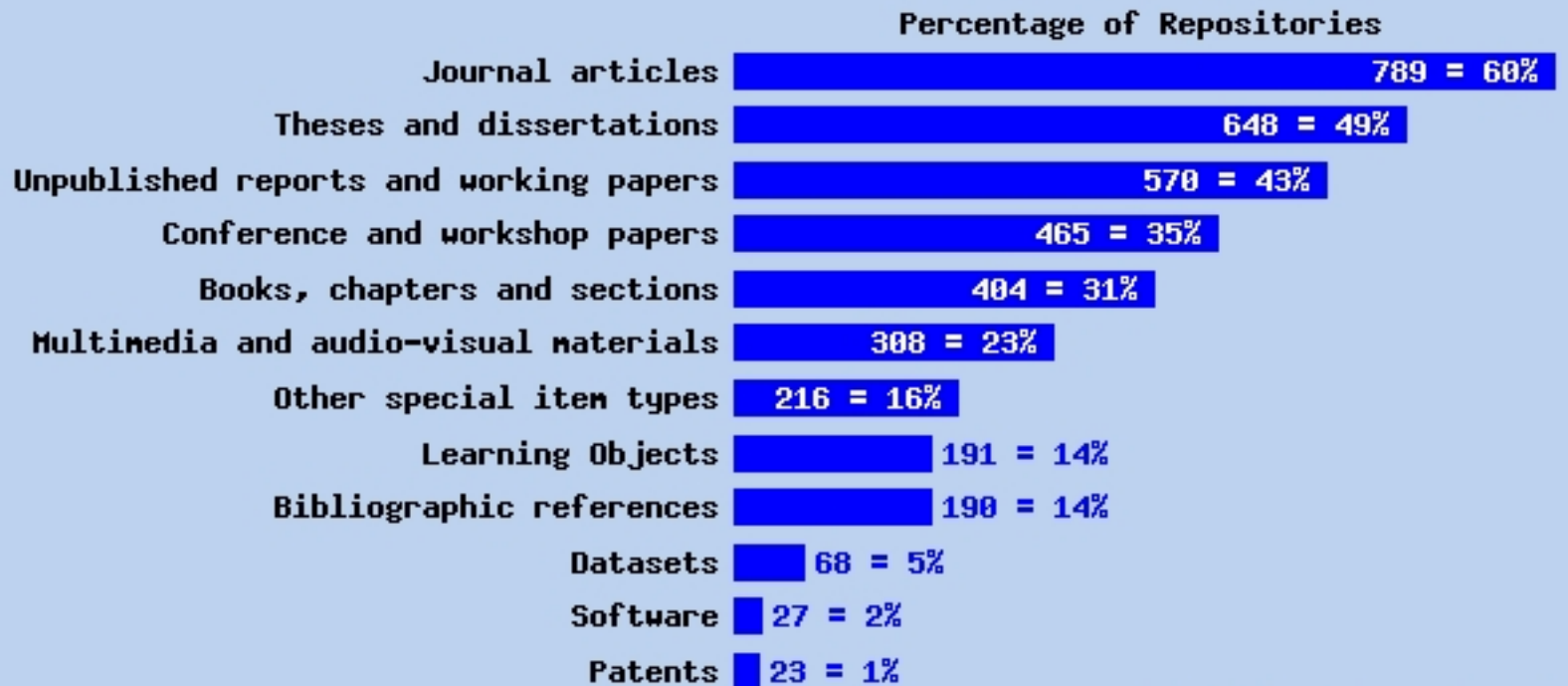



Introduction

Idiopathic intracranial hypertension (IIH) has many possible aetiological factors with grave symptoms and severe morbidity. Elevated intracranial pressure is a common observation in IIH and is associated with cerebral venous flow restriction at various sites. There are indications that the anatomy of the transverse sinus may play a crucial role in the development of IIH.

The dural venous sinuses are endothelial-lined spaces between the endosteal and meningeal layers of the dura, and form where the dural folds attach¹. These sinuses drain blood from the large veins on the surface of the brain. Ultimately, almost all the blood from the brain will drain through the dural venous sinuses into the internal jugular veins². In this study we focused mainly on the anatomical basis of the transverse sinuses which pass laterally from the confluence of sinuses, grooving the occipital bones and the posteroinferior angles of the parietal bones³.

A venographic hidden stenosis at the junction of middle and lateral third of the transverse sinus has been observed by Subramaniam et al. (2004) in patients suffering from idiopathic intracranial hypertension⁴. They conducted a pilot study in 10 human cadavers where 20 transverse sinuses were explored to resolve the anatomical basis of this stenosis⁵. Subramaniam et al. (2004) observed the presence of septa of varying sizes. They concluded that the presence of a large septum is one of the possible aetiological factors in venographic cryptic stenosis that might be involved in idiopathic intracranial hypertension⁶. According to Subramaniam et al. (2004), elevated intracranial dural sinus pressure is a common observation in IIH and is associated with cerebral venous flow restriction at various sites⁷. King et al. (1989) have shown that there is bilateral outflow restriction at the junction of middle and lateral third of the transverse dural sinus in patients suffering from IIH⁸. Tumour compression on venous sinuses has also been documented to cause cerebral venous outflow restriction⁹.

Aim

The aim of this study was to identify the structures which may show signs of potential venographic filling defect qualities, which ultimately may lead to increased intracranial dural sinus venous pressure.

Materials and Methods

Sample
After obtaining ethical clearance (S185/2007), 30 human cadavers of both sexes were dissected in the dissecting rooms of the Department of Anatomy, School of Medicine, University of Pretoria. In addition to the dissections, post-contrast CT scans of six of these (n=6) patients were obtained retrospectively with

Morphologically, the cadaver study revealed the trabeculae as thin string-like structures, yet solid and strong. The implantation sites of these trabeculae appear a little broader and thicker (Figure 5). Septa of variable sizes were observed, from small "pillar"-like structures to large broad structures (Figure 6). Like the trabeculae, the implantation sites of the smaller septa appear to be broader and thicker and bear a resemblance to "pedestals" for these "pillar"-like structures. Radiologically the post-contrast CT scans revealed typical filling defects in septal or granular shapes, relevant to the specific structure (Figure 7).

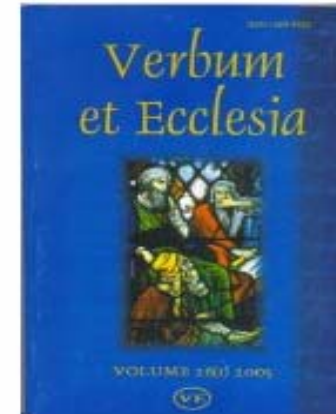

Consisting of six levels, this building houses the [UP Library Service Head Office](#) as well as the faculty libraries for [Humanities](#), [Theology](#), [Natural and Agricultural Sciences](#), [Engineering](#), [Built Environment and Information technology \(EBIT\)](#) and [Economics and Management Sciences](#). It forms a focal point of the University's Hatfield Campus. The original library was initially housed in the [Old Arts building](#) before being relocated to the [Old Merensky Library](#). Despite expansions to the [Old Merensky Library](#) in 1957, it soon became too small and the firm Lou, Marais, Marquard and Kuhn was appointed in 1969 to design a new library. Construction started in November 1971 and in August 1975 the building was completed. In the construction process the southern wing of the [Old Chemistry building](#) was demolished. An interesting feature of the library is the spacious feel of the ground floor due to the three-level high ceiling in the central area. The panelled tapestry in the foyer was commissioned in commemoration of the Centenary celebrations of the University in 2008 and was designed and embroidered by rural community members of the Kaross™ embroidery initiative in the Limpopo province. Adjacent to the library there is a study centre that accommodates up to 1 230 students and is open seven days a week, 24 hours a day.



Historical Background [edit]

In 1933 it was decided by the University to construct a separate building for the library which was then still located in the Old Arts building. With a contribution of £10 000 from mining geologist Dr [Hans Merensky](#), construction started in 1937. General [Jan Smuts](#) laid the cornerstone on 11 October 1937 and on 15 April 1938 the building was officially opened.

"This country has given me so much that I am only too happy to be allowed to help it to develop and to be able to give back to it a fraction of what it has given to me..." - Hans Merensky, at the opening of the Merensky Library.

In designing the building, architect Gerhard Moerdyk was influenced by various styles, including Art Deco, Neo-Classicism, Arts and Crafts, as well as local styles such as Cape Dutch and Regency. Moerdyk himself described the building as a study in Persian style, with influences from Africa including the Zimbabwe and ancient Egyptian ruins. He used local materials and incorporated symbols of African origin. The prominent zigzag pattern, for example, is taken from the Zimbabwe ruins and represents water and fertility, the crocodile as a water figure and the bird as a symbol of space, symbolizing the freedom and creativity of the author. The curving of the walls symbolises an open book. The green bevelled glass windows were imported from Italy and helped to minimise heat from the sun and also protected paper against ultraviolet light. The design of the building is a source of controversy and speculation with some claiming that Moerdyk used it as a practice run for the design of the [Voortrekker Monument](#), as there are many similarities between the two buildings. Today this national monument serves as the Edoardo Villa museum and also houses amongst others, a [Mimi Coertse](#), Marita Napier and the largest [South African](#) sheet music

World university rankings - UCT's web presence

UCT, as a good research university, likes to compete in world rankings, endorsing its high international profile. Well, we have created another competition, in relative terms, but I nevertheless have some unsolicited advice on how we can improve our ranking even further to power our way into the ['Premier League'](#) top 200 of this particular competition.

We are talking about the [Webometrics](#) world ranking of university websites, which has just released its 2008 rankings (thanks to Peter Suber's Open Access News for bringing this to my attention). UCT comes in at number 385 out of over 14,000 universities. Not bad at all - it puts us at the [top of Africa](#) and gets us in ahead of all but two Latin American universities and all Indian universities (where Bangalore comes in at 605). Not unexpectedly, the top 8 African universities are from South Africa, with Stellenbosch second at 654 and Rhodes third at 722. UNISA, surprisingly comes in quite low - 8th, at 1,499. DUT is the lowest rated South African university at 8,735.

Welcome to Gray Area

Digital technologies and the liberalising of licensing regimes have the potential to open up access to knowledge in the digital age. The Publishing and Alternative Licensing Models in Africa (PALM Africa) project is researching how open content approaches employing flexible licensing could work in conjunction with local publishing in developing countries to improve access to learning materials.

There is an urgent need to see how these new models can facilitate access and distribution in developing countries, especially in the African context, where access to Internet connectivity is very limited and effective distribution of learning materials is a serious challenge. This means that print is often needed and the PALM project investigates, among other models, how open access content can be combined with print delivery for maximum reach.
