To ensure that our graduates are properly trained and can practice under any conditions in the country, we maintain an academic hospital on our Onderstepoort campus and two satellite veterinary clinics.

The Onderstepoort Veterinary Academic Hospital (OVAH) is the destination of choice for veterinary care for animals, and plays a critical role in animal care in the communities around us.

Activities at the OVAH include ongoing sterilisation clinics, mobile community animal health clinics, veterinary services to subsistence farmers and commercial farmer support. The OVAH is also a comprehensive specialist hospital that allows us to offer tertiary care to our patients right up to advanced heart surgery or to even giving a parrot a new beak.

Unlike our medical academic hospitals, the OVAH receives no state funding for medication or operations/maintenance of our equipment. As a result, we are reliant on our clients to support our activities as well as to rely on donations to the hospital and faculty from the public.

From all our activities, as a faculty we have prioritised service delivery to our surrounding communities who cannot afford the care their animals deserve, as well as to enhance our country's capacity for food production as a project we hold dear.

However, what truly differentiates us is our pool of talented veterinarians and researcher staff, who are subject experts in the country.
