Pauline and I wish you all a *PEACEFUL and BLESSED CHRISTMAS* together with your families. May the New Year which lies ahead be filled with joy and success.



From the Dean's Desk

As the year draws to a close one inevitably begins to look back on the events which have taken place during the year. To say that 1994 has been an incredible and momentous year in the history of South Africa is probably still an understatement. The first true "general" election and the subsequent inauguration of a new State President were amazing events which appeared to almost miraculously emerge from a state of confusion and high tension and against the predictions of many commentators. That they happened peacefully and that the whole process of the shift in power occurred without a protracted, bloody conflict is an unique achievement which was a privilege to witness and be a part of. Truly liberating events for our whole nation out of which flowed, and continue to flow, many other significant happenings. Rejoining the world and Africa through the United Nations and through re-acceptance into the Commonwealth, the Organization for African Unity and other bodies were each milestones in their own right. Many of these events happened so thick and fast that their significance may only now be filtering through. Perhaps winning medals at the Commonwealth Games (well done the bowlers!) and smashing the English cricket team on their own hallowed turf at Lords in the first test on English soil for many years did help to bring home some of the enormity of the year's achievements at national and international level!

Op Fakulteitsvlak het ons ook gedurende 1994 veel sukses behaal. Voor- en nagraadse asook voortgesette opleiding het vlot verloop. Prestasies op navorsingsgebied is uitgelig tydens 'n uiter suksesvolle Fakulteitsdag. Hoë vlak opleiding deur middel van diens is gehandhaaf in alle afdelings van die Veterinêre Akademiese Hospitaal asook buite die fakulteit met kuddebesoek ensovoorts. 'n Nuwe opwindende element van dienslewering en opleiding het ook hier bygekom in die vorm van uitreik-klinieke in woonbuurte waar basiese veterinêre dienste tot nou toe uiter beperk of nie beskikbaar was nie. Die stigting van 'n Fakulteits Uitreikkomitee onder voorsitterskap van prof Tammi Krecek (geluk Tammi met die dosent van die jaar toekenning!) sal sonder twyfel hierdie aspek van die Fakulteit se aktiwiteite nog verder uitbrei. Skakeling met ouers deur middel van 'n besonder suksesvolle ouerdag, met die professie deur die Veeartsraad, SAVV, OVI en Medunsa, met georganiseerde asook die ontwikkelende landbousektor en die Stigting vir Navorsing en Ontwikkeling, en met streeksfakulteite in Mozambique, Zambië, Tanzanië, Kenia en die Namibiese Veterinêre Vereniging het deur die jaar plaasgevind. Strategiese beplanning, kurrikulering op voor- en nagraadse vlak, navorsingsbestuur en ontwikkeling van die fakulteit se rekenaar infrastruktuur het ook deurlopende aandag geniet. En na 12 jaar se harde werk loop die Onderstepoort bouprojek ook nou plus minus tot 'n einde! Voorwaar 'n produktiewe jaar.

As we begin to close the book on 1994 we must however begin to look ahead at 1995. The changes of 1994, as momentous as they are, have brought uncertainties and challenges. Veterinary education has come under the spotlight through investigations by commissions of the Advisory Council of Universities and Technicons and the African National Congress. While the final report of the AUT has now been released the ANC report is not yet available. The non-appearance of this report is both frustrating and counter-productive while the reasons for its non-appearance remain obscure. There is no doubt however, that these reports, when they do both see the light of the day and are fused through consensus, will have a significant impact on the current state of veterinary training. Pre-veterinary training, para-veterinary training and fusion of the two existing faculties could be part of the changes. The keys to the successful implementation of these changes will be relevance and the maintenance of standards. While the latter aspect has negative connotations in the minds of some they are vital to the success of any program. No matter how relevant, sub-standard training is meaningless. In implementing these changes while keeping what is good, we shall have to call upon all our resources and all our resourcefulness to be successful. Those of you with the chronically overdeveloped work ethics will no doubt come up trumps once again while the rest will also have to rise to the occasion. Let's approach the future as a team with faith, pride and confidence. We can do it!

A DREAM COMES TRUE - A VISIT TO THE MECCA OF GENETICS

EDITOR'S NOTE : PROF OSTERHOFF IS RETIRED FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF VETERINARY ETHOLOGY. HE CONTINUES TO BE A REGULAR CONTRIBUTOR TO THE NEWSLETTER.

After the Conference of the International Society of Animal Genetics in July 1994 in Prague a visit to the Abbey of Brno (earlier named Brunn) was a real "Must".

Every Veterinarian remembers Mendel's Laws either from his school days or from the lectures in the first semester of the Second Year.

By way of repetition : Gregor Johann Mendel (1822 - 1884) Abbot of Brunn, Moravia : his experiments in the cross-fertilization of garden peas led to the formulation of Mendel's Laws of heredity, showing that certain characters, i.e. height, colour, etc., depend on the presence of hereditary determining factors (later called genes) which may be either dominant or recessive.

Mendel's original paper "*Versuche euber Pflanzenhydriben*" describing the results of his experiments was published in the journal of an obscure Austrian natural history society in 1866. His paper was ignored and indeed entirely forgotten for thirty-four years. Then in the year 1900, three botanists working independently - De Vries, Correns and Tschermark - rediscovered the principles of segregation and independent assortment of hereditary characters and Mendel's earlier work was piously desinterred from the archives of Brunn. Later, it was proved that "Mendelian inheritance" - as it was called - could also be applied to animal breeding.


It was a great experience to wander in Mendel's experimental garden, to admire the statue of Mendel and to roam around in the MENDELIUM, as the museum is called. What is usually not known is the fact that Mendel tried to prove his laws on many plant species and they should be listed here : *Antirrhinum*, *Aquilegia*, *Calceolaria*, *Campanula*, *Carex*,

Cheiranthus, *Cirsium*, *Dianthus*, *Ficaria*, *Fuchsia*, *Geum*, *Hieracium*, *Ipomoea*, *Linaria*, *Lychnis*, *Malus*, *Matthiola*, *Mirabilis*, *Plaseolus*, *Pirus*, *Potentilla*, *Prunus*, *Verbascum*, *Veronica*, *Viola*, *Tropaeolum* and *Zea*.

It should also be noted that Mendel's laws and Mendelian inheritance were completely scrapped in school and University Curriculae in Czechoslovakia from 1948 to 1965 because Modern Genetics did not agree with the ideology of the rulers of that country. In the meantime several institutes in the new Czech Republic are closing the gap and can be regarded as leaders in the field of biotechnology. ☐





Congratulations to Mr George Ramokolo on the birth of a son during June.



Ons innige simpatie word betuig aan Mnr Simon Mnonyane met die dood van sy broer gedurende Oktober.



IN MEMORIAM

On 1 September 1994 Professor Anna Verster, passed away. Anna had been ill for several months from a respiratory condition.


Anna was born in 1931 in Bethulie in the Orange Free State. After receiving her BSc and MSc degrees she accepted a research post at the Helminthology Division, Onderstepoort Veterinary Institute and moved up the ranks to Chief Specialist Officer. In 1985, she accepted a senior lecturing post at the Faculty of Veterinary Science, University of Pretoria and received several promotions to that of full Professor. She retired on 31 July this year due to poor health.

During the past 34 years, Anna was a guest of top scientists in the field of veterinary parasitology in many countries in the northern and southern hemispheres. Most recently, in August 1993, she was invited to speak on veterinary education at a world congress of

veterinary parasitologists in Cambridge, UK.

Anna's academic achievements are numerous. Many of her publications remain classic works, especially those on tapeworms which af-


tain Scott Medal of the South African Biological Association and in 1992 the Elsdon-Dew Medal of the Parasitological Society of Southern Africa. These awards acknowledged the contributions she made to our knowledge of disease in Africa and the world.

Anna was a naturalist in every sense of the word. Her affinity for animals was demonstrated in the many wild animals which she "adopted", often into her home. Her love for the flora was legendary. It was not unusual to see her visitors arrive with seedpods in hand to be assisted on the identification of a plant or tree.



PROF SAKKIE TREE AF



Sakkie van Rensburg, Vrystaater van geboorte, se verbintenis met Onderstepoort begin in 1962 wanneer hy as tweedejaar student die Veeartsenykunde kursus voortsit. Hy ontmoet ook hier vir Annette Laubscher, destyds ontvangsdame by buite-pasiënte en later Laboratorium-Assistente by Drs van Drimmelen en wyle Charlie Howell - voorwaar liefde met die eerste oogopslag. Na verwerwing van die BVSc-graad in 1965 sluit hy aan by die Departement Patologie by die Navorsingsinstituut te Onderstepoort met die aanvanklike gedagte om vir twee jaar Patologie te doen ter wille van goeie ondervinding. Die samewerking met groot gees-

te soos Prof Daan Smit, Roy Tustin, Piet Basson, Pine Pienaar en Jean du Plessis wat die lokale talent uitgemaak het, asook Bob McCully, Gene McConnel en George Imes wat as gasnavorsers vanaf die A.F.I.P. tye in Patologie kom spandeer het, maak die wêreld van Patologie so interessant dat dit 'n lewenslange loopbaan word.

Op 1 April 1967 tree Sakkie tot die dosentekorps van die Fakulteit Veeartsenykunde toe as deeltydse dosent in Patologie. In dieselfde maand tree hy ook in die huwelik met Annette. Uit die huwelik word drie seuns gebore waarvan een 'n prokureur, een 'n BSc-Boubestuur student en die derde nog 'n skolier is.

Met "uitlywing" op 1 April 1974 sluit hy as voltydse Senior Lektor aan by die Departement Patologie waar hy saam met Prof Louw van den Heever van Voedselhygiëne die Departement geleei het tot Prof Tustin as Departementshoof weer by die Fakulteit aangesluit het. Sakkie verwerf die MMedVet(Path) graad in 1977 en word daarna bevorder tot Mede-Professor en later Volle Professor in die

Departement Patologie. Sy belangstellings is uiteenlopend, maar is veral in die Patologie van toksiese plante gesetel. Hy het deur die jare aan verskeie nasionale en internasionale kongresse deelgeneem en voordragte aldaar gelewer. Hy het 43 wetenskaplike publikasies tot sy krediet waarvan hy in 22 daarvan die senior outeur is.

Gedurende April 1994, na 27 jaar diens in die Departement Patologie van die Fakulteit Veeartsenykunde, moes Sakkie egter sy loopbaan beëindig. Swak visie van genetiese oorsprong - horingvliesoorplantings op beide oë en die dra van 'n bril sedert 2-jarige ouderdom ten spyt - het dit vir hom onmoontlik gemaak om sy beroep as Patoloog verder suksesvol te bedryf.

Tuis is hy gesinsman by uitstek met 'n groot liefde vir houtwerk. Hy stap ook graag wanneer die tyd dit toelaat - veral as die omgewing die Natalse Drakensberge is. Sy gunsteling ontspanning is kampeer en is hy op sy gelukkigste in sy karavaan in die Drakensberge of langs die see. Hopelik sal hy genoeg hiervan kan inpas in die toekoms! ◻



VETERINARY PUBLIC HEALTH

The Department presented a highly successful two day course, entitled "*Understand your Food Act*" at the Faculty during May in conjunction with the Department of Health. The course was aimed at familiarising veterinarians and environmental health officers with the contents and background of the regulations under the Foodstuffs, Cosmetics and Disinfectants Act. Also included in the programme was a guided tour of various departments and the Veterinary Academic Hospital. The response of the course was overwhelming. Approximately 290 delegates from as far afield as Ballito to Beacon Bay and Keimoes to Koffiefontein attended.

Dr Bruce Gummow was one of 27 delegates selected to participate in a post-graduate programme presented by the Wageningen Agricultural University in Nairobi, Kenya. The workshop was entitled "*Animal Health and Economics - Principles and Applications*" and involved hands-on experience in basic and advanced methods of economic analysis, decision analysis for risky choice in animal health management, and national policy development in animal health. After the workshop he presented a paper at the 7th International Symposium on Veterinary Epidemiology and Economics also held in Nairobi, Kenya. Both the workshops and symposium enabled stronger ties to be made with internationally recognised experts in the field of epidemiology and economics. The knowledge gained will be added to the post-graduate course in epidemiology next year.
