

What is copyright?



Copyright is an intellectual property license with ownership rights of the authors. It protects the expression of the work against infringement by other writers or entities.



Copyright infringement and its consequences




- Copyright infringement is the use of copyrighted material without the owner's permission
- The South African Copyright Act 98 of 1978 stipulates monetary penalties for infringement; a fine at a minimum of R5 000 per infringement + The maximum fine can be R10 000
- It also makes provision for **criminal penalties** imprisonment of up to **3 years for a first conviction.**



The 10% copyright limitation "rule"

- The copyright law allows a user to copy only up to 10% of a book or one full chapter for course pack material.
- Should you require more rather buy the book or contact the publisher directly.
- Each student must buy a copy
- A copy can be made available in the library





How to use eBooks under the database subscription list


- All registered students and staff members have access;
- A stable / permanent link may be shared;
- Portions can be downloaded;





How to use database subscription articles

- All registered students and staff members have access;
- A stable / permanent link may be shared;
- Portions ca be downloaded;
- Refrain from linking directly to a PDF.







- DALRO is the South African copyright licensing organization representing authors and publishers of literary, artistic and dramatic works;
- R1,10c per page per student + VAT;
- No. of students + Total page numbers to be used;
- Copyright clearance is requested through DALRO should a lecturer want to distribute or relink a pdf copy through ClickUp;
- Permission lasts for 12months therefore a renewal is done yearly.





- Set of principles and practices for distributing research outputs online freely;
- Open Access returns us to the values of science: to help advance and improve society by providing immediate and unrestricted access to the latest research;
- All electronic resources that are made available on the internet like YouTube content.

MOST FREE



ATTRIBUTION

CC BY

This license lets you distribute, remix, tweak, and build upon the original work, even commercially, as long as you credit the original creation. This is the most accommodating of licenses offered.



ATTRIBUTION-SHAREALIKE

CC BY-SA

This license lets you remix, tweak, and build upon the original work even for commercial purposes, as long as you credit the original work and license your new creations under the identical terms. This license is often compared to "copyleft" free and open source software licenses. All new works based on the work should carry the same license, so any derivatives will also allow commercial use. This is the license used by Wikipedia.



ATTRIBUTION-NODERIVS

CC BY-ND

This license allows for redistribution, commercial and non-commercial, as long as it is passed along unchanged and in whole, with credit to the original work



ATTRIBUTION-NONCOMMERCIAL

CC BY-NC

This license lets you remix, tweak, and build upon the original work non-commercially. Your new works must be non-commercial and acknowledge the original work, but you don't have to license your derivative works on the same terms.



ATTRIBUTION-NONCOMMERCIAL-SHAREALIKE

CC BY-NC-SA

This license lets you remix, tweak, and build upon the original work non-commercially, as long as you credit the original work and license your new creations under the identical terms.



ATTRIBUTION-NONCOMMERCIAL-NODERIVS

CC BY-NC-ND

This license is the most restrictive of the six main licenses, only allowing you to download the original work and share it with others as long as you credit the original work. You can't change the original work in any way or use it commercially.

LEAST FREE

Fair use

- Unlimited copying of work for a user;
- Only one copy;
- Cannot be shared;
- No permission needed from the copyright owner or paying compensation.
